



How does ERO find out how my child's school is doing?

ERO visits the school and gathers a lot of information from students, teachers, leaders, the school board, parents and whānau, and more. We observe classes and look at the work students are doing. We use this information and the school's data to tell us how well the school is going in the areas that matter most for students. We have a strong focus on the progress students are making in their learning.

Who can I talk to about my school's ERO report?

For areas where your child's school is doing well, it is great to celebrate this with your child's teacher and other school staff. If you are concerned about anything in the school's report, you can talk to your child's teacher or the school leaders (for example principals, deputies, or heads of year). If you are still worried, you can talk to your school board.

All of ERO's reports are on our website, www.ero.govt.nz – you can find them by searching for the name of your child's school. We'll be using our new reports for all schools that are visited by ERO from Term 2, 2026 onwards.
